TRASH & RECYCLING PICKUP

Weekly curbside service. Place your BROWN (garbage) and blue (recycling) bins at the curb by 7 AM on collection day.

BRUSH & BULK COLLECTION

Pickup happens monthly during your assigned week. Set items out by 7 AM Monday.

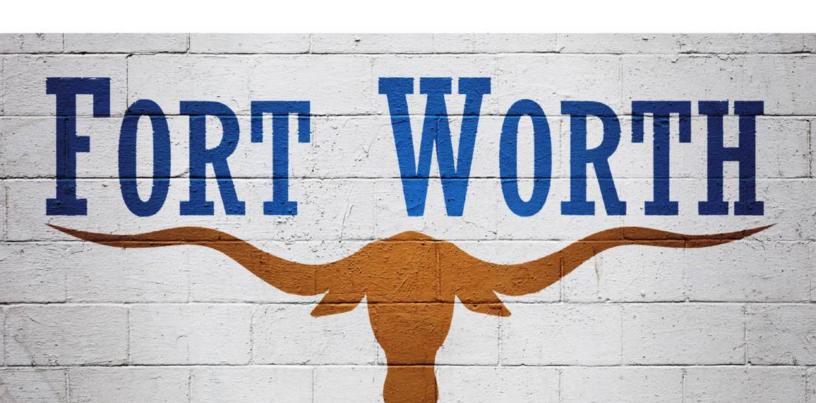
DROP-OFF STATIONS

WHAT YOU CAN BRING

Drop-Off Stations accept a wide variety of items, including:

- · Household trash and bulk waste
- · Yard waste and brush (bundled or bagged)
- Recyclables (cardboard, paper, plastics, metals)
- Electronics (computers, TVs, and small appliances)
- Household chemicals (paint, cleaners, pool chemicals, etc.)
- · Old tires (limit per visit applies)

Tip: Bring proof of residency, such as a recent Fort Worth water bill and a matching photo ID.

Drop-Off Stations do not accept:

- · Commercial or contractor waste
- · Construction debris from hired contractors
- · Ammunition or explosives
- Medical waste

HOURS OF OPERATION

Most stations are open:

- Monday-Friday: 8 AM-6 PM
- Saturday: 8 AM-5 PM
- · Closed Sundays & city holidays

FREE MULCH AVAILABLE

While you're there, grab free mulch to use in your landscaping. This mulch is made from collected yard trimmings, recycling at its best!

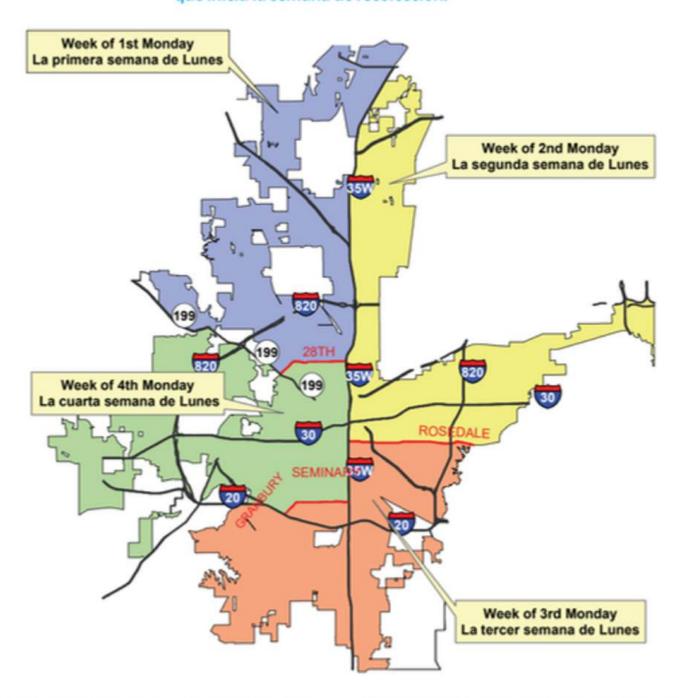

FILING YOUR HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION IN TARRANT COUNTY

WHAT IS A HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION?

A Homestead Exemption reduces your property tax bill by removing part of your home's value from taxation. This can save you hundreds of dollars each year.

DO I QUALIFY?

You must meet all of these:

- Your home was your primary residence on January 1 of the year you are applying.
- You own the property.
- · You live in Texas.
- · You can now apply as soon as you close on your home.
- You have to apply every five years! Set yourself a reminder.

HOW DO I APPLY?

It's free and easy:

- Visit the Tarrant Appraisal District (TAD) website, www.tad.org
- Search for Residential Homestead Exemption Application
- Complete the form and provide any required documents (like proof of residency).
- · Submit online, by mail, or in person.

Tip: Never pay anyone to file this for you, this process is always free.

OTHER EXEMPTIONS YOU MIGHT QUALIFY FOR:

- Over-65 Exemption
- Disability Exemption
- Veteran Exemption



FILING YOUR HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION IN TARRANT COUNTY

Each Spring, you'll get a Property Tax Valuation Notice from TAD, showing:

- Market Value: What TAD believes your property is worth
- Taxable/Assessed Value: What your taxes are calculated on after exemptions

How Your Tax Bill is Calculated:

- Taxable Value × Local Tax Rates = Your Annual Tax Bill
- Bills are issued Oct–Nov each year
- Payment is due by January 31 of the following year
- Payments after February 1 are considered delinquent, and penalties/interest will apply

HOW TO CHANGE YOUR ADDRESS ON YOUR TEXAS DRIVER'S LICENSE

TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY (DPS):

YOU MUST UPDATE YOUR DRIVER'S LICENSE WITHIN 30 DAYS OF MOVING.

Online (Quickest & Easiest):

- Visit txapps.texas.gov/tolapp/txdl/
- Follow the prompts to change your address.
- Pay the fee (\$11 as of 2024).
- · Your new license will be mailed to you.

In Person:

- · Visit any Texas DPS office.
- · Bring your current driver's license.
- Fill out the change of address application and pay the fee.

By Mail:

You can mail in a completed form DL-64, but online is much faster.

Vehicle Registration:

Don't forget to update your address on your vehicle registration at TxDMV.gov.



HOW TO CHANGE YOUR MAILING ADDRESS

- · Online:
 - o Go to www.usps.com/move
 - Complete the Change of Address form.
 - o There's a \$1.10 identity verification fee.
- In Person:
 - Visit any post office and request PS Form 3575.
 - Fill it out and drop it in the provided slot.
- Timing:
 - Mail forwarding usually starts 7–10 business days after you submit your request.

YEAR-ROUND OUTDOOR WATERING REQUIREMENTS



KNOW YOUR WATERING SCHEDULE

MONDAY

No watering!

TUESDAY & FRIDAY

Non-Residential Sites (apartments, business, etc)

WEDNESDAY & SATURDAY (EVEN)

Residential addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8

THURSDAY & SUNDAY (ODD)

Residential addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9

DO NOT:

- No watering by irrigation systems or sprinklers between 10 a.m.-6 p.m.
- Watering by hand-held hose, drip irrigation or soaker hose is allowed at any time.
- · No watering hard surfaces.
- No watering during precipitation.
- No water waste through runoff, or through missing, misaligned or broken sprinkler heads.

WATER RESTRICTION ENFORCEMENT

ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION THAT VIOLATES, DISOBEYS, OMITS, NEGLECTS OR REFUSES TO COMPLY WITH THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE FINED UP TO \$2,000 FOR EACH OFFENSE. EACH DAY A VIOLATION IS PERMITTED TO EXIST WILL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE.

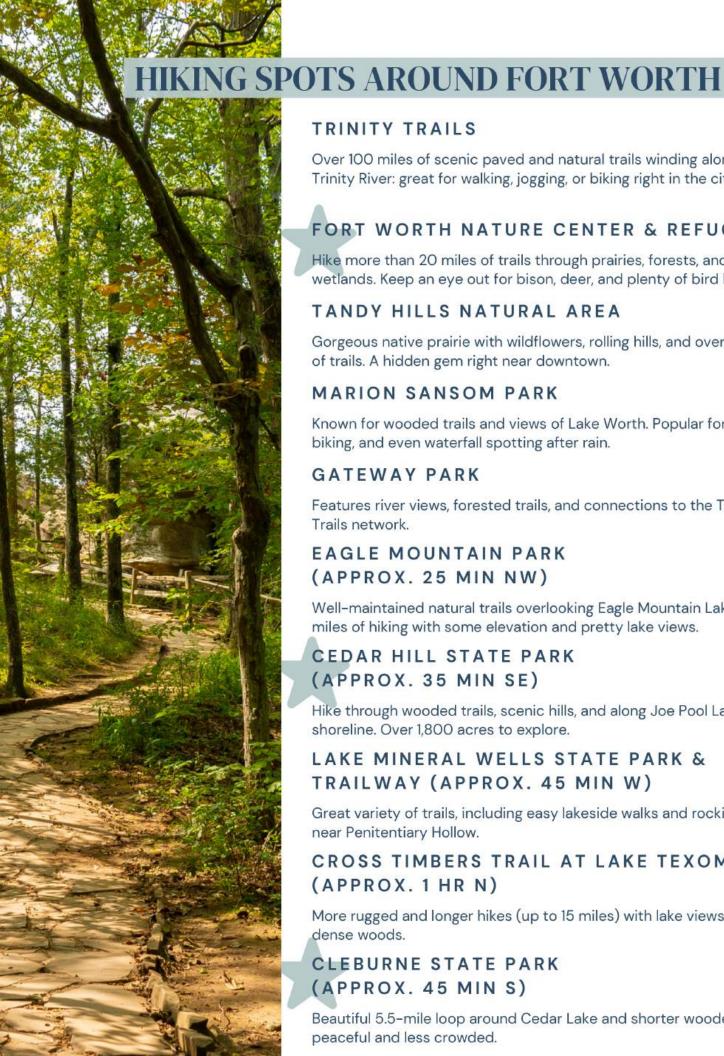

TRINITY TRAILS

Over 100 miles of scenic paved and natural trails winding along the Trinity River: great for walking, jogging, or biking right in the city.

FORT WORTH NATURE CENTER & REFUGE

Hike more than 20 miles of trails through prairies, forests, and wetlands. Keep an eye out for bison, deer, and plenty of bird life.

TANDY HILLS NATURAL AREA

Gorgeous native prairie with wildflowers, rolling hills, and over 10 miles of trails. A hidden gem right near downtown.

MARION SANSOM PARK

Known for wooded trails and views of Lake Worth. Popular for hiking, biking, and even waterfall spotting after rain.

GATEWAY PARK

Features river views, forested trails, and connections to the Trinity Trails network.

EAGLE MOUNTAIN PARK (APPROX. 25 MIN NW)

Well-maintained natural trails overlooking Eagle Mountain Lake. Over 5 miles of hiking with some elevation and pretty lake views.

CEDAR HILL STATE PARK (APPROX. 35 MIN SE)

Hike through wooded trails, scenic hills, and along Joe Pool Lake shoreline. Over 1,800 acres to explore.

LAKE MINERAL WELLS STATE PARK & TRAILWAY (APPROX. 45 MIN W)

Great variety of trails, including easy lakeside walks and rockier climbs near Penitentiary Hollow.

CROSS TIMBERS TRAIL AT LAKE TEXOMA (APPROX. 1 HR N)

More rugged and longer hikes (up to 15 miles) with lake views and dense woods.

CLEBURNE STATE PARK (APPROX. 45 MIN S)

Beautiful 5.5-mile loop around Cedar Lake and shorter wooded trailspeaceful and less crowded.

TOPGOLF FORT WORTH

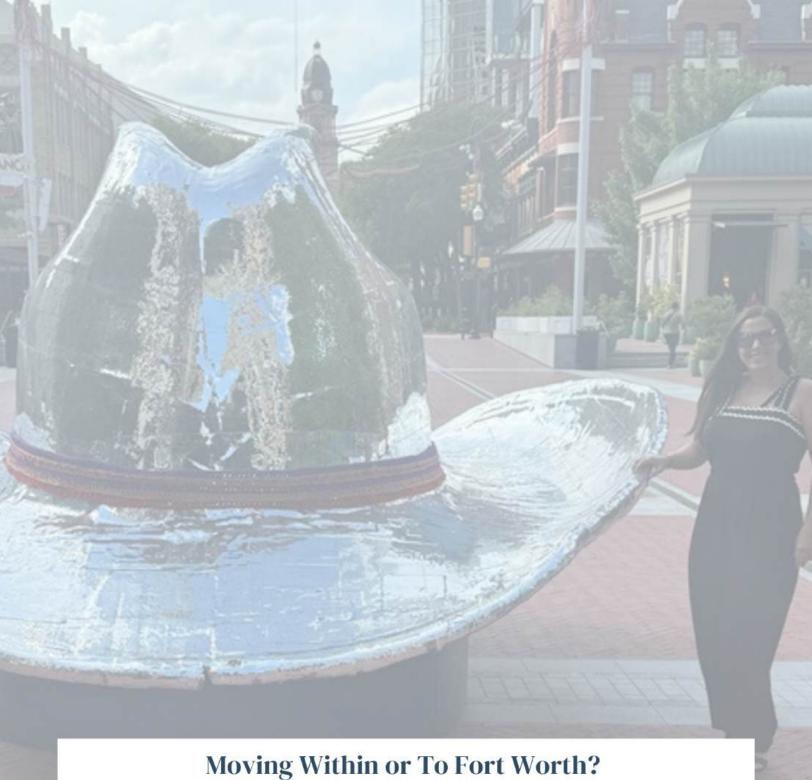

Information About Brokerage Services



Texas law requires all real estate license holders to give the following information about brokerage services to prospective buyers, tenants, sellers and landlords.

TYPES OF REAL ESTATE LICENSE HOLDERS:

A BROKER is responsible for all brokerage activities, including acts performed by sales agents sponsored by the broker.

A SALES AGENT must be sponsored by a broker and works with clients on behalf of the broker.

A BROKER'S MINIMUM DUTIES REQUIRED BY LAW (A client is the person or party that the broker represents):

Put the interests of the client above all others, including the broker's own interests;

Inform the client of any material information about the property or transaction received by the broker;

Answer the client's questions and present any offer to or counter-offer from the client; and

Treat all parties to a real estate transaction honestly and fairly.

A LICENSE HOLDER CAN REPRESENT A PARTY IN A REAL ESTATE TRANSACTION:

AS AGENT FOR OWNER (SELLER/LANDLORD): The broker becomes the property owner's agent through an agreement with the owner, usually in a written listing to sell or property management agreement. An owner's agent must perform the broker's minimum duties above and must inform the owner of any material information about the property or transaction known by the agent, including information disclosed to the agent or subagent by the buyer or buyer's agent. An owner's agent fees are not set by law and are fully negotiable.

AS AGENT FOR BUYER/TENANT: The broker becomes the buyer/tenant's agent by agreeing to represent the buyer, usually through a written representation agreement. A buyer's agent must perform the broker's minimum duties above and must inform the buyer of any material information about the property or transaction known by the agent, including information disclosed to the agent by the seller or seller's agent. A buyer's/tenant's agent fees are not set by law and are fully negotiable.

AS AGENT FOR BOTH - INTERMEDIARY: To act as an intermediary between the parties the broker must first obtain the written agreement of each party to the transaction. The written agreement must state who will pay the broker and, in conspicuous bold or underlined print, set forth the broker's obligations as an intermediary. A broker who acts as an intermediary:

Must treat all parties to the transaction impartially and fairly;

May, with the parties' written consent, appoint a different license holder associated with the broker to each party (owner and

buyer) to communicate with, provide opinions and advice to, and carry out the instructions of each party to the transaction. Must not, unless specifically authorized in writing to do so by the party, disclose:

- that the owner will accept a price less than the written asking price;
- that the buyer/tenant will pay a price greater than the price submitted in a written offer; and
- any confidential information or any other information that a party specifically instructs the broker in writing not to disclose, unless required to do so by law.

AS SUBAGENT: A license holder acts as a subagent when aiding a buyer in a transaction without an agreement to represent the buyer. A subagent can assist the buyer but does not represent the buyer and must place the interests of the owner first.

TO AVOID DISPUTES, ALL AGREEMENTS BETWEEN YOU AND A BROKER SHOULD BE IN WRITING AND CLEARLY ESTABLISH:

The broker's duties and responsibilities to you, and your obligations under the representation agreement.

Who will pay the broker for services provided to you, when payment will be made and how the payment will be calculated.
