I give my sellers this guide to help them get ready for the market. I hope it helps you as you consider making a move in the future!

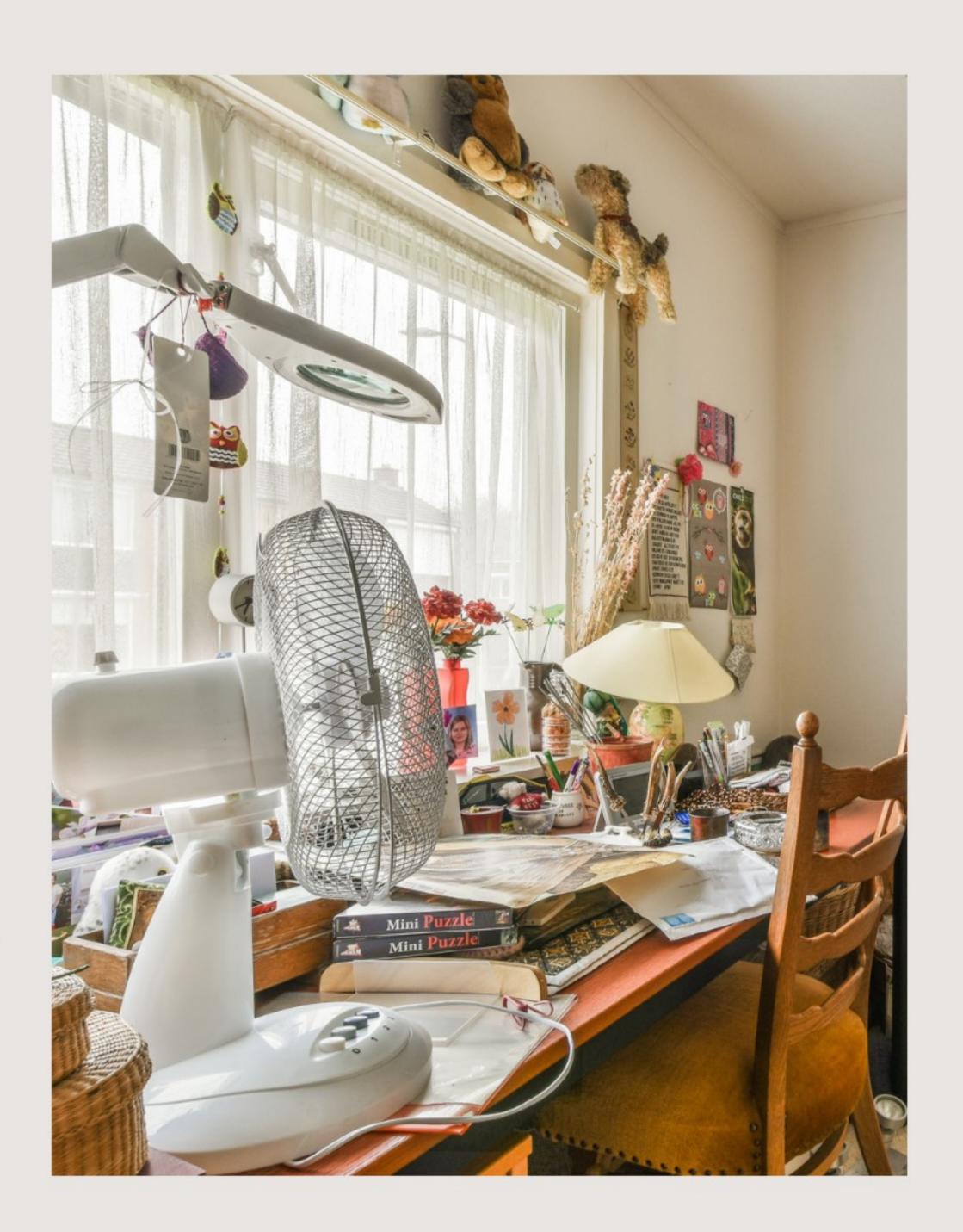

Does that picture look like your house? It's ok if it does. I'm not judging you, I promise! In fact, my desk likely looks like that right now, too! But... if I was selling my house, I'd clean it up really quick!

In order to sell your home for TOP DOLLAR, you have to appeal to the most buyers possible. And some people simply cannot see past the clutter.

You are already preparing to move so start taking inventory of all your stuff. Go room by room, through every nook and cranny and get rid of the excess that you don't need. Is it broken? Throw it away. No longer being used? Maybe have a yard sale or consider donating to a charity. Get rid of anything you won't be taking with you to the new place.



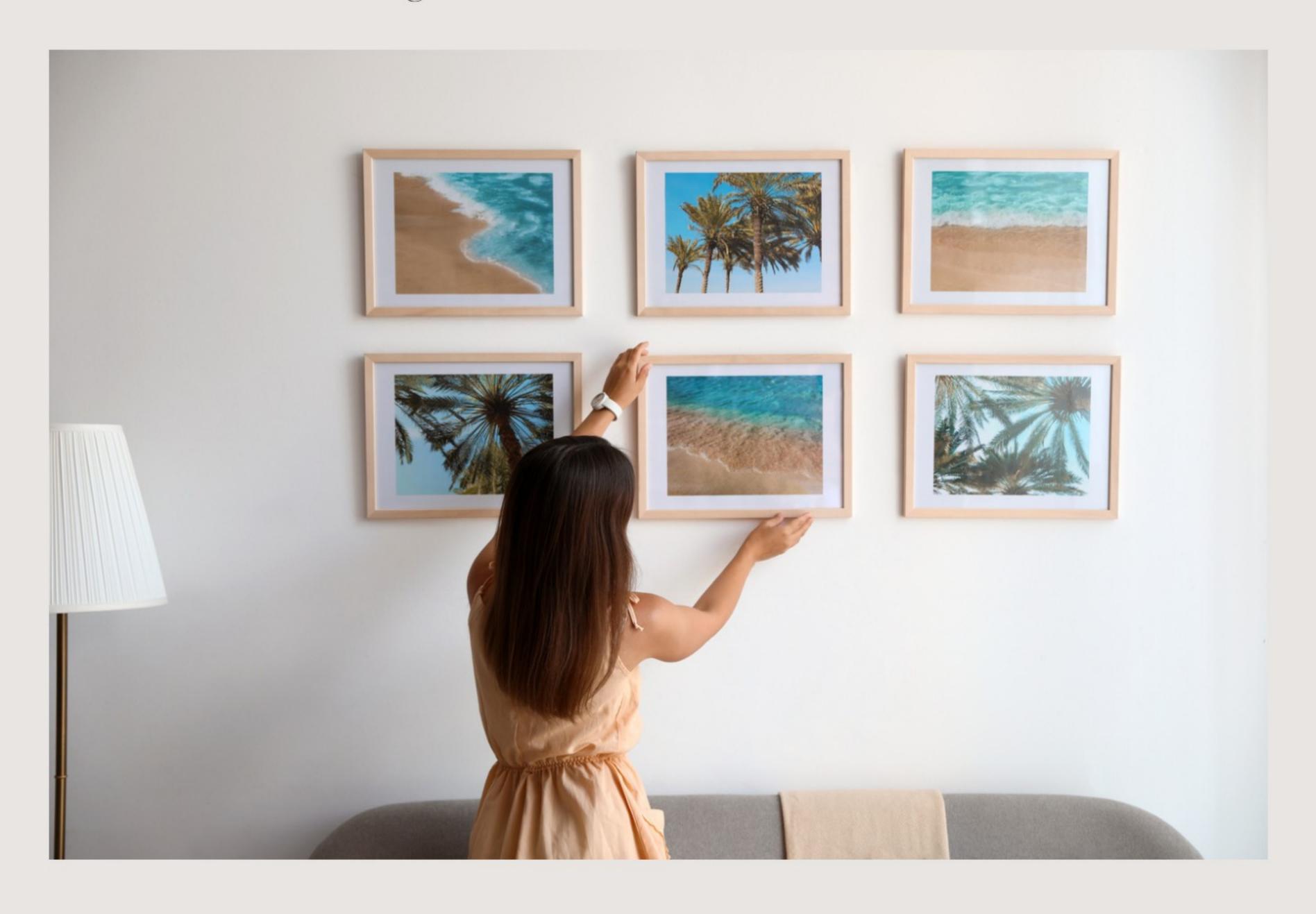
Now box up 25% of what's left. Keep furniture and decor to a minimum. We want each room to feel spacious. You'll be AMAZED at how much bigger your house feels with 25% of the stuff boxed up and out of the house.

Wondering where to put all that? Go ahead and put it in the garage. Buyers realize you're moving, boxes in the garage show you're ready to make a deal. No garage? Get a small storage unit.

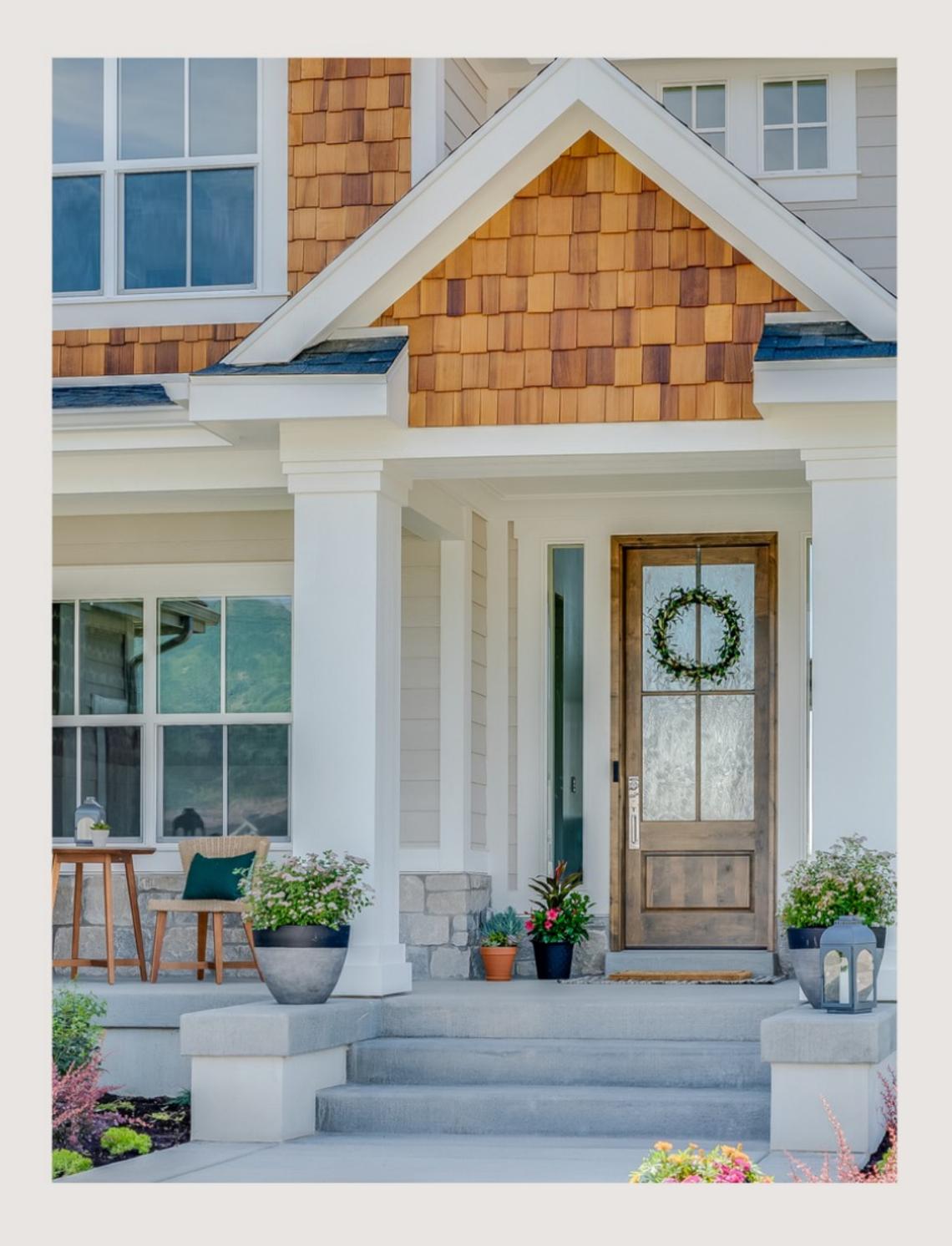
STEP 2 DEPERSONALIZE

It's time to put away your family pictures. I'm sure they are cute! But, you want a buyer to walk into your home and visualize themselves living there. Think of model homes. That's the look we are going for! If you have a photo collage, you can leave the frames up so there aren't a bunch of nail holes exposed, and you can fill the frames with scenes from nature, stock images or even scraps of fabric.

Don't forget to remove art and magnets from the fridge. Reduce the amount of "knick knacks" on display. It's best to put away keepsakes laying around the house and things that may offend other buyers, like religious items or political banners. Remember we are trying to create a neutral space that buyers can envision themselves living in.



STEP 3 FRESHEN UP



You have 7 seconds to make a first impression. Let me ask you a question- how long does it take for you to walk from your car in the driveway to your front door? Curb appeal is very important so don't skimp here. Add fresh mulch or pinestraw, plant some flowers, add a pretty wreath to the front door. Pressure wash the exterior and driveway. Touch up the front door paint if needed.

Consider a fresh coat of paint if you can swing it financially, but new trim paint really pops too!

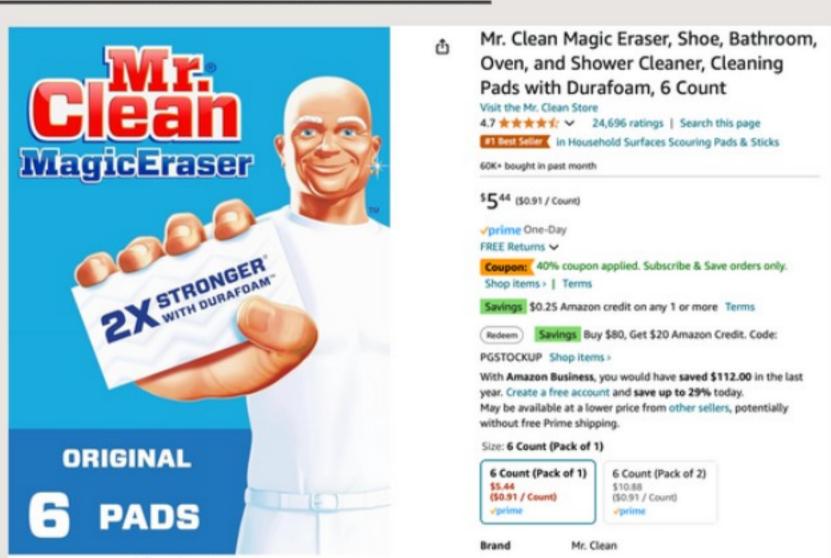
Don't forget the inside too though!

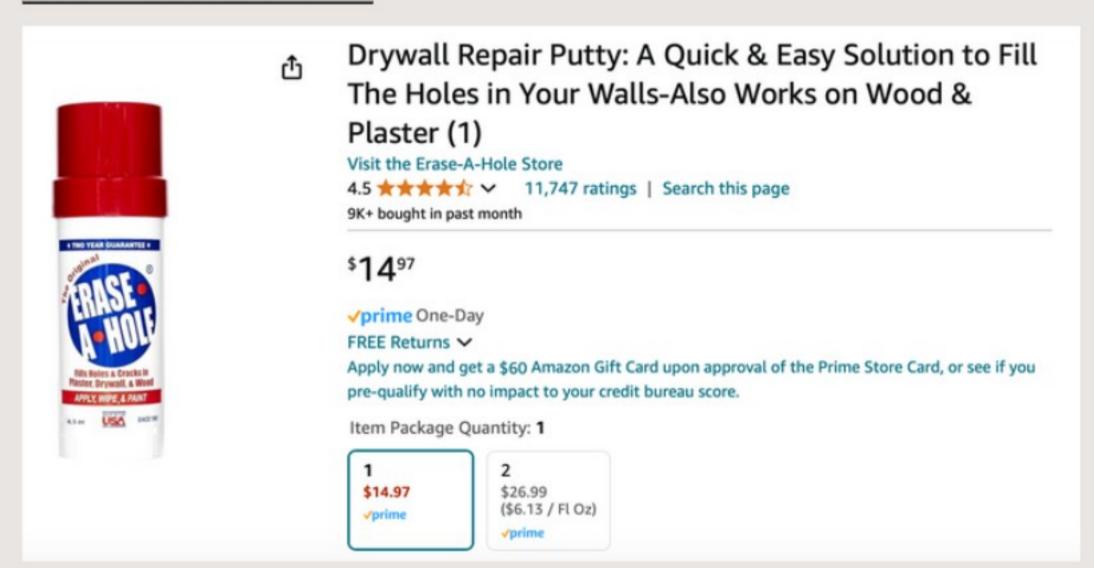

I have a storage space loaded with home decor items. We use these items to add to your space or to give vacant listings a cozier vibe.









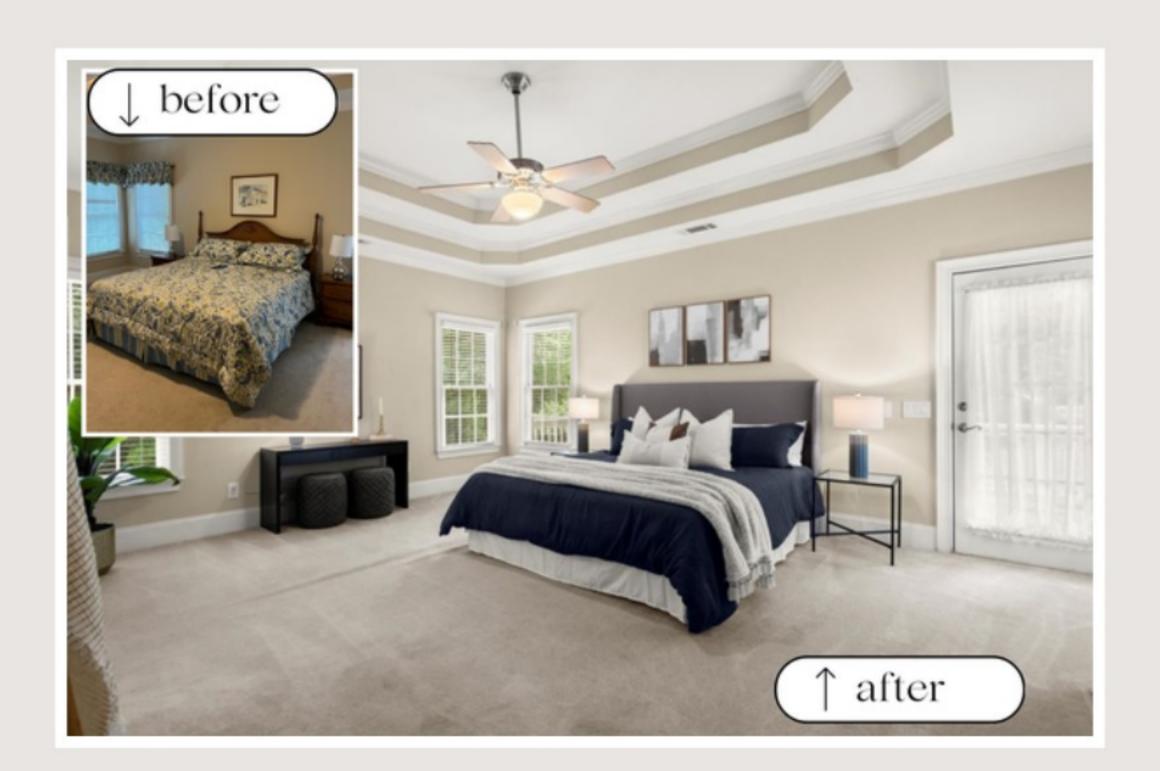
We can also invest in virtual staging to help buyers picture furniture in a space. Some homes are better suited for professional staging.
