Best for Urban Living & Walkability

If you want to live in a **bustling area** with great restaurants, nightlife, and entertainment, check out:

- LoDo (Lower Downtown) -Historic and lively, packed with nightlife, sports bars, and easy access to Union Station.
- RiNo (River North) Artsy and vibrant, known for its breweries, street art, and creative spaces.
- LoHi (Lower Highlands) A stylish, upscale area with trendy restaurants and incredible city views.
- Capitol Hill Historic charm meets city life with walkable streets, local cafes, and a laid-back feel.
- Washington Park (Wash Park) -Perfect for those who want an urban feel with access to parks for running, biking, and walking dogs.

Local Hack: Many urban homes don't have garages, so check for **permit-only** parking or garages for rent if you own a car.

Best for Families & Top-Rated Schools

If you're looking for **great schools**, parks, and a safe suburban feel. these areas are perfect:

- **Highlands Ranch** A wellplanned community with excellent schools, parks, and recreation centers.
- **Centennial** A quieter suburb with strong schools, family-friendly parks, and great shopping.
- Parker A fast-growing area with newer homes, larger lots, and excellent schools.
- **Broomfield** A great middle ground between Denver and Boulder, with a mix of urban and suburban life.
- **Littleton** A charming suburb with a historic downtown, great schools, and easy mountain access.

Local Hack: Colorado has an open **enrollment system**, so you can apply for schools outside of your district if you find a better option for your kids.

Best for Outdoor Lovers & Mountain Access

If your weekends are all about hiking, biking, skiing, and exploring **nature**, check out these areas:

- Golden A historic town at the foothills of the mountains with breweries, trails, and an outdoorsy vibe.
- **Sloan's Lake** One of the few places in Denver with waterfront living, perfect for jogging, biking, and paddleboarding.
- **Evergreen** A true mountain town just 40 minutes from downtown, surrounded by forests and hiking trails.
- **Morrison** Famous for Red Rocks Amphitheater, with small-town charm and stunning views.
- Louisville A top-rated city with plenty of trails, open spaces, and easy access to Boulder.

Local Hack: Even if you live in central Denver, you're never more than 30 minutes from a great hiking trail.

While Denver is more affordable than cities like San Francisco or Seattle, it's still pricier than the national average. Gas prices usually hover around \$3.50/gallon, but fluctuate seasonally. Groceries are slightly above the national average, but still cheaper than coastal cities.

Local Hack: Colorado's property taxes are relatively low (around **0.6%-0.8% of home value**), which helps offset higher home prices.



Moving to Denver: Logistics & Practical Steps

Change Your Address

Update USPS, banks, and subscriptions.

Set Up Utilities

Xcel Energy (electric/gas), Denver Water, Comcast/CenturyLink (internet).

Get a Colorado Driver's License

Required within **30 days** (DMV: <u>dmv.colorado.gov</u>).

Register Your Vehicle

Some counties require **emissions testing** before registration.

Enroll Kids in School

Check Denver Public Schools (DPS) or private options.

📌 Things to Do as Soon as You Move:

Local Hack: Avoid the DMV rush by scheduling an appointment online—some locations have long wait times.

Adjusting to Denver's Climate & Altitude

Thin Air & Altitude Sickness

Give yourself **a few weeks to adjust**, drink plenty of water, and limit alcohol intake at first.

Dry Climate

Invest in a **humidifier**, lip balm, and lotion—your skin will thank you!

Snow & Weather

Snowstorms happen, but Denver's **300+ days of sunshine** mean it melts quickly.

Winter Gear

You'll need a warm coat, gloves, and boots, but Denver isn't as harsh as the Midwest.

Denver's **5,280-foot elevation** means there are a few things to keep in mind.

Local Hack: Even in winter, Denver gets **plenty of 50-60°F days**—don't be surprised if people wear shorts in February!




