

Budget Considerations

Closing Costs

Plan for 2–4% of purchase price (\$8,000–16,000 on a \$400,000 home) for closing costs including attorney fees, title insurance, and transfer taxes

Property Insurance

\$1,500-\$3,000 annually, varying based on coastal proximity, home age, and construction details

Moving Expenses

Long-distance moves typically cost \$4,000-\$7,000 depending on distance and volume
