A new local flavor hub: Southern Weaving Food Hall just opened in Easley, bringing together multiple locally-owned food stalls under one roof. From tacos to barbecue, it's where locals go to taste a little bit of everything without leaving town.

A Friday night under the lights: Catch an Easley High Green Wave football game — the whole town shows up, and the fall air + marching band makes it feel like classic small-town Americana.



A sweet stop with history: Joe's Ice Cream Parlor has been scooping since the 1940s, and fall is the time for a hot dog + milkshake combo that feels like stepping back in time.

A downtown scavenger hunt with history: Trains on Main is a self-guided walking tour through downtown Easley where you search for 10 bronze train statues hidden along Main Street. It's a nod to Easley's railroad roots and a fun off-the-beaten-path adventure only locals talk about.



A Saturday morning downtown ritual: Easley Farmers Market is small but mighty, with local honey, breads, and seasonal produce. Long-time residents say it's the best place to actually meet your neighbors.

A boutique with Southern charm: Under the Carolina Moon is a downtown Easley favorite for cozy sweaters, seasonal candles, and one-of-a-kind gifts. Locals love stopping by in the fall for a little "treat yourself"

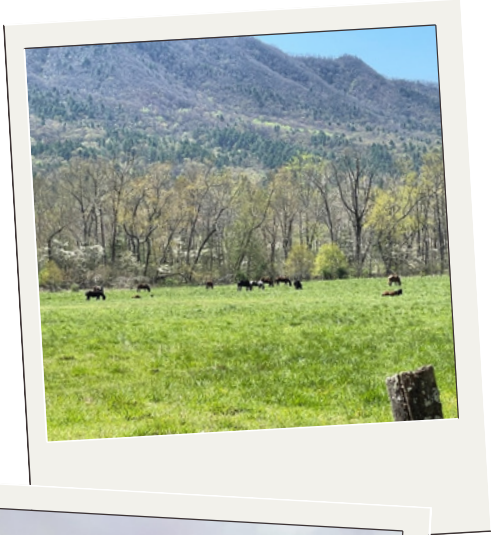

- **Check out:** Biltmore Estate– the largest private home in the United States. Drive the Blue Ridge Parkway for a beautiful scene with stunning fall colors.

Helen, GA

- **Travel time:** 2 hours 45 minutes

- **Check out:** Helen's Oktoberfest runs September through early November. It's long-running and full of Bavarian food, music, dancing, and festive decorations
