Living in Jacksonville, FL offers the perfect blend of laid-back coastal charm and vibrant city life. As the largest city by land area in the U.S., Jacksonville gives residents room to breathe—whether you're drawn to the beachside lifestyle, historic neighborhoods, or the bustling urban core. With year-round sunshine, a growing food scene, riverfront parks, and access to top-rated schools and military bases, it's a city that truly has something for everyone. From morning coffee in Riverside to sunset walks at Jacksonville Beach, local living here means balancing opportunity with relaxation, and always being just minutes away from your next favorite spot.

CLIMATE

Jacksonville, FL has a humid subtropical climate, which means you'll experience hot summers, mild winters, and plenty of sunshine year-round.

Here's a quick breakdown:

- * Summer (June-September):
- Hot and humid, with highs in the upper 80s to mid-90s °F. Afternoon thunderstorms are common but usually short-lived.
- (Great beach weather—but pack your sunscreen!)
- # Fall (October–November):
- Warm and breezy with temperatures ranging from the 70s to 80s. Humidity drops, making it one of the best times to enjoy the outdoors.
- Winter (December-February):
- Mild and comfortable. Daytime temps hover in the 60s, sometimes reaching the 70s. Freezing temps are rare and snow is extremely uncommon.
- Pleasant and sunny, with temps in the 70s and low 80s. Flowers bloom, festivals ramp up, and it's ideal for outdoor fun.

COST OF LIVING

Jacksonville offers a very affordable cost of living—around 8% lower than the national average and about 7–8% less than Florida overall.

Overall Comparisons

- Housing (buying & renting): ~13% below national average
- Utilities: ~10% to 15% lower
- Healthcare: ~13-15% lower
- Transportation: ~13% lower
- Goods & services (e.g. clothing, entertainment): ~4–5% lower
- Food/groceries: ~4% higher than the national average


What it Means for You

GATE RIVER RUN

America's largest 15 K road race and the official US Championship for the distance takes place the first Saturday in March. It draws over 13,000 runners and is one of Jacksonville's most prestigious races.



JAZZ FESTIVAL

Held over Memorial Day weekend downtown, this long-running festival features live jazz on multiple stages, competitions, brunches, and free concerts—drawing crowds since 1979.



WORLD OF NATIONS

A springtime cultural festival offering a passport-like journey through global pavilions, food, performances, arts and crafts—fun for all ages



SPRINGING THE BLUES

Taking place the first weekend in April at Jacksonville Beach, this is one of the East Coast's oldest free blues festivals, dating back to 1990

AMELIA ISLAND CONCOURS

A prestigious classic car show held every March on nearby Amelia Island. It showcases rare vintage automobiles, elegant events like a black-tie dinner, and concours judging.



SEAWALK MUSIC FESTIVAL

This one-day beachside music festival at the Seawalk Pavilion brings together local artists, food vendors, craft booths, and a vibrant community atmosphere. It's a celebration of Jacksonville's creative and cultural spirit.



Held every July, this is the world's largest kingfish fishing tournament. It includes competition on the water plus a big public weigh-in, seafood market, and fireworks.



TAXSLAYER GATOR BOWL

A New Year's Day college football bowl game held at EverBank Stadium since 1946. The surrounding festivities even include a downtown parade on New Year's Eve

MAYO CLINIC

Ranked #1 hospital in Florida by U.S. News & World Report, with national top-50 specialties in areas like cardiology, oncology, neurology, and more. It is a top-tier, multispecialty system with a 304-bed onsite hospital



UF HEALTH JACKSONVILLE

This teaching hospital has 695 beds, is a Level I adult & Level II pediatric trauma center, and offers advanced treatments including proton therapy and comprehensive stroke care



BAPTIST MEDICAL CENTER

Along with the adjacent Wolfson Children's Hospital, serves a full spectrum of adult and pediatric care. Wolfson is the region's only ACS-verified Level I pediatric trauma center



ST.VINCENTS

A large 528-bed community hospital offering specialties like cardiology, cancer care, neurology, orthopedics, and home to Jacksonville's first openheart surgery program







Fun Around Town



JACKSONVILLE ZOO

Discover over 2,000 animals and 1,000 plant species across 122 acres. Highlights include the awardwinning Range of the Jaguar exhibit, a walk-through Lorikeet exhibit, and a manatee rescue center—perfect for a day of wildlife and botanical immersion.

RIVERSIDE ARTS MARKET

Enjoy scenic views along the St. Johns River on the Northbank and Southbank Riverwalks. On Saturdays, be sure to swing by Riverside Arts Market under the Fuller Warren Bridge for local food, crafts, and live music.



CATTY SHACK RANCH WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

CATTY SHACK RANCH

Meet rescued big cats like tigers and lions in a spacious sanctuary devoted to their care. Tours and evening feedings provide a memorable wildlife experience.

CUMMER MUSEUM

Explore a distinguished art collection alongside beautifully landscaped riverfront gardens. The museum often features seasonal events, educational programs, and stunning views.

FRIENDSHIP FOUNTAIN

Experience one of the world's largest tiered fountains on the Northbank Riverwalk. It's beautifully lit after dark—wonderful for a waterfront stroll or evening photo-op

MUSEUM OF SCIENCE & HISTORY (MOSH)

A hands-on, interactive museum on the Southbank, MOSH offers exhibits ranging from space and science to local history, plus a planetarium—perfect for families or curious minds.



HISTORIC ST. AUGUSTINE

Discover rich history with visits to Castillo de San Marcos, Fort Matanzas, the Fountain of Youth site, and the St. Augustine Lighthouse—all fascinating landmarks in America's oldest city.

FLORIDA THEATRE

Step back in time at this beautifully restored 1927 "movie palace," offering concerts, ballet, live theatre, and special events downtown.




The Avenues
