Cost of Living Breakdown

Here's what you can expect to spend in Palm Coast compared to the national average:

Category	Palm Coast	National Average
 Overall Cost of Living	92 (8% below avg)	100
 Median Home Price	\$320,000	\$420,000
 Average Rent (2BR)	\$1,450/mo	\$1,850/mo
 Property Tax Rate	1.02%	1.07%
 Utilities (Monthly)	\$180	\$200
 Groceries	95 (5% below avg)	100
 Gas & Transportation	98 (2% below avg)	100

Bottom Line

You'll save approximately **\$15,000-\$20,000** per year compared to living in Miami, Orlando, or Tampa. Housing is the biggest savings factor.

No State Income Tax

Florida has ZERO state income tax, which means more money stays in your pocket. For a household earning \$75,000/year, that's an extra \$3,000-\$5,000 compared to states with income tax.

Palm Coast Neighborhoods Guide

Each neighborhood has its own personality. I like to break the neighborhoods into 5 categories: non-HOA, HOA non-gated, HOA and gated, 55+ communities, and condos.

Non-HOA Neighborhoods

- These are largely going to be your Palm Coast Sections or subdivisions
 - Some may have sidewalks or streetlights, but the majority don't
 - Some may have pep tanks
 - The sections are not in geographical alphabetical order and not all letters have a section

- These will typically have sidewalks, streetlights and underground utilities
 - HOA fees tend to be low
 - There may be CDD fees

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5 Costly Mistakes to Avoid

👉 **DON'T skip this section**

1. **Not Understanding Flood Zones** — Parts of Palm Coast are in flood zones. Always check FEMA maps and factor flood insurance costs (\$500-\$2,000/year) into your budget before buying.
2. **Buying Without Visiting in Summer** — Summer heat and humidity are intense (90°F+ with high humidity). Visit during July-August to make sure you can handle it year-round.
3. **Ignoring HOA Rules and Fees** — Many communities have strict HOA regulations and fees ranging from \$50-\$500/month. Read the rules carefully before committing.
4. **Underestimating Hurricane Prep Costs** — Hurricane shutters, insurance deductibles, and emergency supplies add up. Budget \$3,000-\$5,000 for proper hurricane preparation.
5. **Assuming You're Close to Everything** — Palm Coast is quiet and spread out. You're 30+ minutes from major shopping, airports are 1+ hour away. Make sure you're comfortable with the distance.

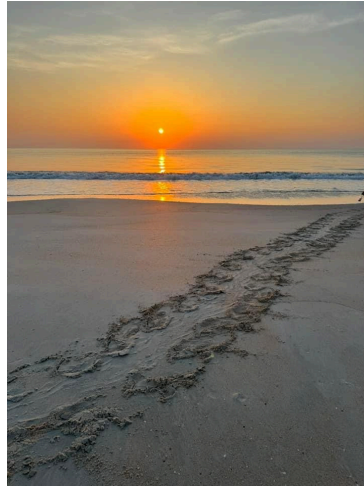
Pro Tip

Your Move Timeline

Follow this checklist to make your move smooth and stress-free:

3-6 Months Before

- Visit Palm Coast in person (ideally during summer)
 - Research neighborhoods and attend open houses
 - Get pre-approved for a mortgage
 - Connect with a local real estate agent
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2-3 Months Before

- Make an offer and complete home inspection
 - Secure homeowners and flood insurance
 - Plan your moving logistics and hire movers
 - Research schools if you have children
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1 Month Before

- Set up utilities (electric, water, internet)
 - Update your address with USPS and important accounts
 - Register vehicles and get Florida driver's license
 - Find local doctors, dentists, and services
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Move-In Week

- Do final walk-through before closing
- Meet your neighbors and explore the area
- Stock up on hurricane supplies (just in case!)
