At a Glance

Portland Climate Overview

Portland sits in a sweet spot — sheltered by the Coast Range to the west and the Cascades to the east — giving it one of the most livable, temperate climates in North America.

By the Numbers

- Summer highs: **75–85°F**
- Winter lows: **35–45°F**
- Annual rainfall: **~37 inches**
- Sunny days: **144+ per year**
- Snow days: **rare, 1–3 per year**
- Humidity: **moderate, lush year-round**

What Makes Portland Unique

- Four genuinely distinct seasons
- Mild winters — rarely freezing hard
- Gloriously dry, warm summers
- Rainy season runs Nov through Mar
- Evergreen forests keep the city lush 365 days
- Mountain access within 90 minutes year-round

What Winters in Portland Are Really Like

The Conditions

- Temps hover between **35–48°F**
- Rain is frequent — misty, not torrential
- Snow is rare; a dusting makes the news
- Daylight as short as **8.5 hours** in December
- Grey skies are the daily vibe Nov–Feb

- Powell's Books — the ultimate winter escape
- Portland's café culture is world-class
- Forest Park trails stay beautiful in the mist
- Mt. Hood skiing just 90 minutes away
- Hood River day trips for cozy mountain charm
- Locals embrace — not endure — the season

Spring in Portland

Spring arrives gradually and gloriously — first with cherry blossoms along the waterfront, then with an explosion of wildflowers, green hills, and farmers markets waking back up across the city.



Cherry Blossom Season

The Tom McCall Waterfront Park erupts in pink each April — one of Portland's most beloved annual spectacles.



Washington Park in Bloom

The International Rose Test Garden peaks in late spring. Portland earns its "City of Roses" title all over again.



Farmers Markets Return

The Portland Saturday Market and neighborhood markets reopen, bursting with local produce, flowers, and artisan goods.

The Season

- Crisp mornings, mild afternoons
- Temps drop from 70°F to 45°F by November
- Foliage peaks mid-October
- Rain returns gently in October

- Hood River Fruit Loop — apples, pears, cider
- Pumpkin patches in Sauvie Island
- Forest Park trails ablaze with color
- Cozy neighborhood coffee shop crawls
- Autumn farmers market harvest season

Style Guide

What to Wear in Portland

Portland fashion is function-meets-style. Locals have mastered the art of layering — looking great while staying dry and ready for anything the forecast throws at them.



Waterproof Shell

A quality waterproof jacket is non-negotiable. Go for breathable Gore-Tex — you'll wear it 6 months of the year.



Waterproof Boots

From trail to city street, waterproof boots keep you comfortable and stylish through wet season.



Umbrella?

Portlanders rarely use them (and quietly judge those who do). A good hood is the local way.



Layer Everything

Mornings can be 45°F and afternoons 68°F. A base layer, mid-layer, and shell gives you full flexibility.



Summer Casual

Summers are dry and warm — light linens, sundresses, and shorts are perfect from June through September.



Hiking Gear

Trail-ready layers and footwear are Portland essentials — the wilderness is always minutes away.

Setting the Record Straight

Portland Weather Myths — Busted

"Does it rain all day, every day?"

No. Portland rain is typically a light drizzle or overcast mist — not heavy downpours. Summers are reliably dry and sunny.

"Does Portland get real snow?"

Rarely in the city. When it does, 1–2 inches shuts things down. For real snow, Mt. Hood is 90 minutes away with world-class skiing.

"Are summers actually beautiful?"

Absolutely. July and August are considered among the best summer weather in the entire country — low humidity, clear skies, long days.

"Is seasonal depression common?"

Some residents use light therapy lamps during winter. But Portland's strong community culture, café scene, and outdoor lifestyle help enormously.

"Can you enjoy outdoor activities year-round?"

Yes. Portlanders hike, bike, and explore in every season. The city is built for outdoor living 365 days a year.
