Exploring possibilities ahead of time makes future decisions feel steady rather than sudden.



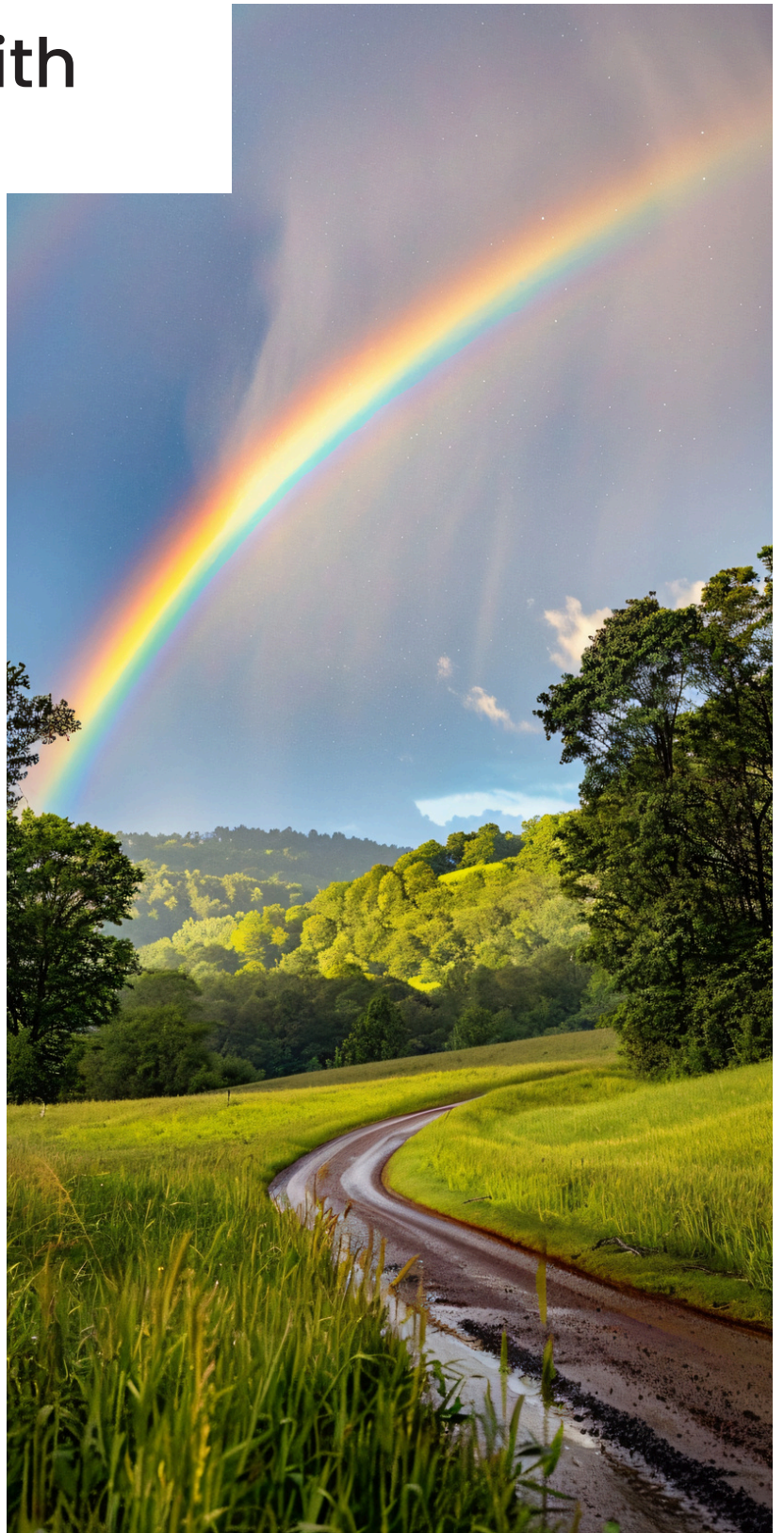
# Move forward with Purpose
