## Cocos Donuts and Coffee Bar

A true neighborhood morning stop just off Ella, serving donuts, breakfast tacos, and coffee. The Mexican mocha and the chorizo biscuits with gravy are regulars' go-tos. Grab something to go or settle in, the vibe is unhurried either way.



## Presleys Southern Good Eatery

## TC Jester Park

Miles of trails wind along White Oak Bayou, shaded by mature trees and lit after dark for evening walks or runs.
